After School Activities

Foundation Stage & Key Stage 1

There is a facility for children to stay after school until 5.00 pm. This after school service is intended for use by parents who are unable to collect at the normal end of school time due to work/business commitments, or who are unavoidably delayed.

Key Stage 2

Pupils may stay at school until 5.00pm each day. Prep is supervised by the teaching staff every day (except Wednesday) between 4.30pm and 5.00pm.

Whilst most extra-curricular activities are offered on Saturday morning, some take place during the late afternoon on weekdays until 5.00pm.

Whilst we understand that, on occasion, a parent/carer is unavoidable delayed, **please aim to collect your child by 5.00pm.**

It is the policy of the Governors to retain the fees and charges at a fixed level for a complete academic year, but they retain the right to revise them if circumstances so dictate.

Registration Fee

£100 non-returnable

Entry Deposit

UK Pupils and Armed Forces with a UK address: £500

Mainland European Pupils (within EEC): £2,000

Rest of the World: £5,500

The deposit will be refunded without interest after the final payment of Fees or other sums due to the school on leaving.

The following are included in the fees:

Full course tuition, library, laboratory, departmental textbooks (but not personal textbooks for use in the preparation for public examinations), basic stationery, most extra-curricular activities, all major sports, team travel and midday meals. In addition, Boarding Fees include breakfasts, evening meals, the washing of school uniform (not dry cleaning), underwear and all bedding.

There are additional termly charges for Personal Accident Insurance, and intensive AEN/EAL tuition.

Individual Private Tuition

£44.70 (per hour) Notice of the withdrawal of a pupil from private lessons must be given to the Head in writing, by the last day of the previous term.

Individual Instrumental Music

£44.70 (per hour) (10 half-hour sessions per term). There may be an additional charge for certain specialist instruments. Notice of the withdrawal of a pupil from private lessons must be given to the Director of Music, in writing, by the last day of the previous term.

Admissions Procedure

An initial parental tour with the Head of the Junior School will be followed by a pupil 'taster day' which allows the prospective pupil to be assessed in numeracy and literacy, as well as getting to know the school from the inside. A copy of a recent school report will also be required. For further information, please refer to the Admissions Policy which can be found on the School's website.

Direct Debit and Fee Insurance Schemes

UK parents can pay their fees and extras conveniently by Direct Debit as the College subscribes to the Holmwoods Termtime Collections scheme or the Fees Company. Further details are available on request. Debit and Credit card payments can also be made for a small administration charge.

Bursaries

Bursaries are means tested. Application Forms are obtainable from the Bursar's Office.

Scholarships

The maximum value of an Academic Scholarship in the Junior School will be 40%. Sports Scholarships are also available, to a maximum of 25%. Scholarship assessments are normally held in January, although late applicants will be considered. If you are interested please contact the Junior School Secretary for an informal discussion and to request the relevant forms.

Fees are due and payable before the commencement of the relevant school term.

One full term's notice must be given in writing to the Head of the Junior School in the following instances:

- if parents wish to cancel a place which they have accepted;
- if parents wish to withdraw a pupil who has entered the Junior School;
- if the pupil wishes to discontinue extra tuition;
- if the pupil wishes to transfer from boarding to day only attendance.

Extras are charged in arrears and are enumerated in detail with the account.

Personal Accident Insurance is obligatory for all pupils.

Specific details of the above and many other issues are given in the parent contract which is sent out with the acceptance form at a later stage.

How to find us:-

By Road:

From London take the M2 /A2 to junction 7, then take the A299 (Thanet Way) towards Manston Airport and Ramsgate.

^Continue following signs for Ramsgate, at the double roundabout you will turn right then left, *straight over at the next roundabout, **then at the next turn left on to the A253 signposted St Lawrence (Nethercourt Hill).

At the next mini-roundabout (St Lawrence Church on your left) bear right and follow the road to a set of traffic lights.

Turn left at the lights into Wilfred Road (signposted to the station) and follow the road past the station on your left. † Take the first left into Princes Road and then straight over at the traffic lights into College Road.

The College Main Entrance is about 150m on your right.

The Junior School Entrance is further along the road on the right.

By Rail:

From London, there are direct trains from both Victoria Station and Charing Cross Station to Ramsgate.

We are then just a short walk or taxi ride away (follow instructions above from †)

By Eurostar from the Continent.

Some trains stop at Ashford International.

There are direct trains from Ashford International to Ramsgate Station approximately every half an hour.

We are then just a short walk or taxi ride away (follow instructions above from †).

By Ferry from the Continent:

From Oostend to Ramsgate. Leave the Port and at the first roundabout turn right and then follow the instructions above 'By Road' from **.

From Calais to Dover. Leave the Port and turn left, follow signs to Ramsgate via the A2 and A256. When you get to 'Cliffs End', turn right at the next roundabout and then follow directions above By Road from *.

By Eurotunnel from the Continent:

Once you leave the terminal, follow the M20/A20 to Dover, then follow directions to Ramsgate via the A2 and A256. At 'Cliffs End', turn right at the roundabout then follow directions as above 'By Road' from *.

Nearest Airports:

Manston (2 miles) - follow directions above 'By Road' from ^.

Gatwick - follow M23 then M25 towards Dartford, then take A2/M2 towards Dover then follow above 'By Road'.

Heathrow - follow signs to M25 towards Dartford, then take A2/M2 towards Dover then follow above 'By Road'.
