It is the policy of the Governors to retain the fees and charges at a fixed level for a complete academic year, but they retain the right to revise them if circumstances so dictate.

Registration Fee

UK, Europe and Rest of the World - £100.00 non-returnable

Entry Deposit

Junior & Senior Pupils

UK Pupils and Armed Forces with a UK address - £500.00.

Mainland European Pupils (within EEC) – £2,000.00.

Junior School

Rest of the World – a deposit of £5,500.

Senior School

Rest of the World – a deposit of £7,500.

The deposit will be refunded without interest after the final payment of Fees or other sums due to the school on leaving.

The following are included in the fees.

Full course tuition, library, laboratory, departmental textbooks, (but not personal textbooks for use in the preparation for public examinations), basic stationery, most extra-curricular activities, all major sports, team travel and midday meals. In addition, Boarding Fees include breakfasts, evening meals and the washing of underwear, school uniform (not dry cleaning), and all bedding.

There are additional termly charges for Personal Accident Insurance, CCF subscription (from Year 9 entry for 3 terms) and EAL and AEN tuition.

Individual Private Tuition

£41.10 (per hour) Notice of the withdrawal of a pupil from private lessons must be given to the Headmaster in writing, by the last day of the previous term.

Individual Instrumental Music

£41.10 (per hour) (10 half-hour sessions per term). There may be an additional charge for certain specialist instruments. Notice of the withdrawal of a pupil from private lessons must be given to the Director of Music, in writing, by the last day of the previous term.

Admissions Procedure:

Kirby House (Years 7-8)

Admissions are based on an interview with the Headmaster. A copy of a recent school report will also be required. Testing will be carried out where appropriate.

Senior School (Years 9-13)

Admissions are initially based on an interview with the Headmaster. An offer of a place will then be dependent on the common entrance exam or GCSE predictions (13+) and generally a minimum of 5 GCSE passes (16+).

EU and overseas

EU and overseas students will be admitted on the basis of current performance, references, a short language test and a short subject knowledge test, based on subject options as interviews are not always possible. All EU and overseas students are assessed by our specialist EAL staff on entry to the College. Appropriate EAL support is then provided, to match the requirements of the student, in our specialist EAL Centre. A high proportion of these courses lead to public examinations. There are charges made for this additional support.

Direct Debit and Fee Insurance Schemes: -

UK parents can pay their fees and extras conveniently by Direct Debit as the College subscribes to the Holmwoods Term time Collections scheme or the Fees Company. Further details are available on request. Debit and Credit card payments can also be made for a small administration charge.

Bursaries

Bursaries are means tested: Application forms are obtainable from the Registrar.

Scholarships

The value of Academic Scholarships will range from 10% to 50% of the fees. Music Scholarships, worth up to 50% fees, can be awarded in Kirby House and the Senior School. They can be awarded in conjunction with the academic scholarships. Sports Scholarships, worth up to 30% fees, are also available in Kirby House and the Senior School. Scholarship assessments are held in November and March although late applicants will be considered. If you are interested please contact the Registrar for an informal discussion and to request the relevant forms.

Fees are due and payable before the commencement of the relevant school term.

One full term's notice must be given in writing to the Headmaster in the following instances:

- if parents wish to cancel a place which they have accepted;
- if parents wish to withdraw a pupil who has entered the College;
- if following the GCSE or AS Level year the pupil will not return for the following year;
- if the pupil wishes to discontinue extra tuition;
- if the pupil wishes to transfer from boarding to day only attendance.

Extras are charged in arrears and are enumerated in detail with the account.

Personal Accident Insurance is obligatory for all pupils.

Specific details of the above and many other issues are given in the parent contract which is sent out with the acceptance form at a later stage.

How to find us:-

By Road:

From London take the M2 /A2 to junction 7, then take the A299 (Thanet Way) towards Manston Airport and Ramsgate.

^Continue following signs for Ramsgate, at the double roundabout you will turn right then left, *straight over at the next roundabout, **then at the next, turn left on to the A253 signposted St Lawrence (Nethercourt Hill).

At the next mini-roundabout (St Lawrence Church on your left) bear right and follow the road to a set of traffic lights.

Turn left at the lights into Wilfred Road (signposted to the station) and follow the road past the station on your left. † Take the first left into Princes Road and then straight over at the traffic lights into College Road.

The College Main Entrance is about 150m on your right.

By Rail:

From London, there are direct trains from both Victoria Station and Charing Cross Station to Ramsgate. We are then just a short walk or taxi ride away (follow instructions above from †)

By Eurostar from the Continent.

Some trains stop at Ashford International.

There are direct trains from Ashford International to Ramsgate Station approximately every half an hour. We are then just a short walk or taxi ride away (follow instructions above from †).

By Ferry from the Continent:

From Oostend to Ramsgate. Leave the Port and at the first round about turn right and then follow the instructions above 'By Road' from **.

From Calais to Dover. Leave the Port and turn left, follow signs to Ramsgate via the A2 and A256. When you get to Cliffs End, turn right at the next roundabout and then follow directions above 'By Road' from *.

By Eurotunnel from the Continent:

Once you leave the terminal, follow the M20/A20 to Dover, then follow directions to Ramsgate via the A2 and A256. At Cliffs End, turn right at the roundabout then follow directions as above 'By Road' from *.

Nearest Airports:

Manston (2 miles) - flights twice a week from Spain & Portugal
follow directions above 'By Road' from ^.

Gatwick - follow M23 then M25 towards Dartford, then take A2/M2 towards Dover
(then follow above 'By Road').

Heathrow - follow signs to M25 towards Dartford, then take A2/M2 towards Dover
